Foreword



2009 has witnessed many upheavals at national level which have impacted on libraries across the spectrum — we have experienced reductions in opening hours, cuts in funding, a recruitment embargo, redundancies, pay cuts, travel restrictions. Yet, as our Annual Report demonstrates, the Library Association of Ireland continues to fly the flag for library and information service provision across the country. The Association via its Groups and Sections continued to provide opportunities for networking as well as valuable CPD courses, seminars and conferences. The vibrancy and pertinence of our Groups and Sections are elaborated in this report. It is heartening that so many of the Groups are cross-sectoral in composition, viz. the Genealogy and Local History Group, the Rare Books Group, the Western and Munster Regional Sections *inter alia*. This reflects the national thrust towards more cross-sectoral access (the Pathways to Learning initiatives etc.) and bodes well for the future.

Some Groups and Sections are more financially secure than others by virtue of their composition, size and geographical catchment areas. Others are less well-funded, hence they appear to be less well positioned to offer courses and conferences to their members. The fact that the Association has a membership base of over 600 means that there are many opportunities for creative and imaginative approaches in organising activities: it would be cost-effective and advantageous in many ways for Groups to occasionally explore and engage in collaborative exercises which would have the effect of enhancing the range of activities they can offer whilst encouraging greater communication between sectors.

The Meitheal Oibre na Gaeilge has made an appeal to refresh its membership. This is an opportunity for those of you who may not yet have participated in a Group to offer your services now. The Meitheal is another example of a Group which invites cross-sectoral participation.

Library Ireland Week in March, to which all Groups and Sections of the Association contributed, continues to focus on all types of library services, showcasing the tremendous range of activities, services and expertise offered by Irish libraries. The professional work of Irish librarians, library initiatives and analysis are showcased in our bi-annual journal, *An Leabharlann*, which goes from strength to strength.

Throughout this year the Executive Board has laid great emphasis on fostering clear lines of communication between the Groups and Sections and the Board, and on encouraging greater communication between the Groups. The Joint Annual Conference provides opportunities for members to engage in networking and learning activities as well as to volunteer speakers for Members Day sessions. We would like to see even greater participation in the coming year.

Three task forces are currently engaged in:

- Reviewing the website with a view to improving it as a working and communications tool
- Taking forward the report of the Working Group on Information Literacy
- Conducting a radical review of the Memorandum and Articles of Association

Finally, the Association maintains a watching brief on matters of relevance to the various sectors, for example the provision of funding for school library services, the need to maintain adequate funding for electronic research resources in the academic sector, the need to maintain professional posts in specialist, governmental and health services in order to guarantee cost-effective and timely information provision. In relation to CPD accreditation, the Education Committee has held initial discussions with the Academic and National Libraries Training Consortium and looks forward to progressing these during the coming year. European Union initiatives relating to copyright law and the Google Book Search Settlement Agreement are just some of the issues which have been addressed by the European and International Panel.

There is still much to be done: I am confident that the commitment of the membership will remain firm and that 2010 will be as successful and productive as the year's work recorded herein.

Joint Conference

Elga Logue (CILIP Ireland – Conference Secretary), Katherine McCloskey (Chair, CILIP Ireland), Mary Murphy (Meath County Libraries – Programme Secretary) formed the Joint Conference Organising Committee.

The CILIP Ireland/LAI Annual Joint Conference 2009 took place in the Hilton Hotel, Lanyon Place, Belfast from Wednesday 29 April to 1 May. The conference, entitled 'Managing Change in the Information Age' attracted more than 100 delegates from all sectors and from across the island – as well as representatives from England, Wales and Scotland plus some 20 exhibitors, from a wide range of library suppliers.

The very timely Opening Address was given by Paul Sweeney (Permanent Secretary, Northern Ireland Department of Culture, Arts and Leisure) in which he referred to the digital revolution that is radically changing both work and leisure. Libraries are often at the forefront of such change – not only as a vital information resource but also as a source of spiritual wellbeing. During difficult times, conferences like this help to lay foundations for the future. That future brings new challenges, of course, but new opportunities as well.

Deirdre Ellis-King (Dublin City Public Libraries), Siobhán Fitzpatrick (Royal Irish Academy),

Irene Knox (Chief Executive of the new Northern Ireland Library Authority — Libraries NI ¾ (http://www.librariesni.org.uk)), further developed the theme of change when she spoke of the exciting time ahead for public libraries in the North. Key principles include regional planning, equitable provision, sharing best practice, community engagement and service delivery tailored to local need, in partnership with other local agencies wherever possible. Performance indicators and impact factors to show the contribution of libraries to priority government agendas are essential, as are substantial staff training and development to promote a shared common vision. Knox concluded that major change cannot be imposed: "you have to bring people along with you".

Madelaine Dennison (Head of the Oireachtas Library and Research Services), picked up where Irene Knox left off by describing in detail the process whereby a reactive "members' reading room" changed rapidly to become a pro-active information service. Library and research functions are now integrated to provide a seamless centralised service to users, with all staff having a client-facing role. Again, Dennison emphasised the need for impact factors to demonstrate added value and for staff training in core values and competencies.

The second day of conference began with Siobhán Fitzpatrick's LAI Presidential Address which again referred to the current rapid rate of change. That has greatly facilitated the finding of information but it has also increased the need for interpretation and evaluation skills. Lifelong learning is recognised as a core activity by both LAI and CILIP. Co-operatively driven initiatives and easy access to e-resources are also key activities and Fitzpatrick cited several current projects which represent best practice e.g. Inspire Foyle, PAL and RASCAL. All library sectors — public, academic and special — on both sides of the border are contributing to such ventures. Indeed, co-operation and collaboration are essential to ensure our users can access the information they need, particularly in a time of reducing budgets: 'let us continue to work together, to address change and to face the challenges of the future'.

Biddy Fisher (CILIP Vice-President) gave a wide-ranging paper on professionalism, ethical standards, codes of conduct and the public good. The CILIP Body of Professional Knowledge (http://www.CILIP.org.uk/qualificationschartership/bpk) distinguishes librarians from other professionals and helps us to identify the unique added value that we provide. Finally, Fisher predicted that compulsory CPD will be introduced by CILIP in order to ensure its members maintain the essential skills required by the ever-evolving work of the future.

Jane Ohlmeyer (Professor of Modern History at Trinity College, Dublin), described a number of current initiatives to digitise historical resources from European libraries, archives and museums. Funding is available but Irish involvement is limited. Consequently, Ohlmeyer argued persuasively for a more co-ordinated strategy, sustainable national infrastructure and greater effort to supply content to Europeana (http://www.europeana.eu/portal/).

The COLICO Annual Lecture was given by Alistair McCleery (Director of the Scottish Centre for the Book) on the theme of 'Small nation publishing'. In today's global economy, in which it is hard for small enterprises to survive it is increasingly difficult to sustain the production of books by local authors on local topics. But public sector support for Scottish writers and publishers has successfully increased consumer choice there, whilst Canada – especially Quebec – has a thriving publishing industry due to intervention at both national and provincial level. McCleery concluded by suggesting that libraries have a crucial role in supporting such work.

Workshops on the second day were many and varied. They covered professional competencies and CPD; library and information research; strategic planning, service evaluation and government support; building refurbishment, digitisation and One Book projects; partnerships between libraries and the BBC; provision of business information.

The conference dinner was hosted by Belfast City Council in the sumptuous surroundings of the Harbour Commissioners Office where the Honourable, the Lord Mayor of Belfast, Tom Hartley and his fellow councillors welcomed the delegates warmly and Councillor Harley spoke with the utmost conviction on the value of libraries to the citizen. Gifts from Belfast City Council to the Library Association were accepted by the President, who presented the Lord Mayor with a copy of the Royal Irish Academy's recent library publication.

The final day saw visits to Bangor Carnegie Library and Belfast Central Library, both impressive and instructive in equal measure.

Sincere thanks are recorded to our CILIP Ireland colleagues, Ms Katherine McCloskey (Chair) and Ms Elga Logue, conference secretary, Ms Mary Murphy, programme secretary, and to the staff of Belfast Libraries, the N.I. Tourist Board, Belfast City Council and the staff of the Lord Mayor's Office, as well as the staffs of the Bangor Carnegie Library and Belfast Central Library for ensuring the success of the conference.

Overall, the Conference was extremely well-organised, interesting and informative. All the speakers showed real passion for libraries and librarianship, in their numerous guises. There was something for everyone, with a lot packed into just a short time. And it was very enjoyable too.

Library Ireland Week

Libraries for Life. 2 -8 March

As a platform to acknowledge the work of libraries every day, in every sector throughout the island, Library Ireland Week was a resounding success. 204 events were organised island-wide, as listed on the Library Ireland website (www.libraryirelandweek.ie) with representation from 18 counties. The range of facilities, resources and services identified was diverse, but no more than the norm for any modern, developed library community. In terms of numbers of activities, the public library sector dominated with events ranging across literature, life-long learning, leisure, the environment, the Irish language e-resources and other aspects of local culture. These appealed to the general public or to targeted sectors such as second chance learners, entrepreneurs,

families, etc. Less extensive perhaps but equally significant was the contribution of the academic, government and special sectors. One of the many examples of provision was the workshop on 'Research Services to Parliamentarians' provided by the Oireachtas Library & Research Service. While this type of provision is routine in many libraries discretely serving institutionalised communities, the Week gave such work important profile to the wider public that benefits from the application of complex library and research services to aspects of economic and cultural development.

Mentoring and networking within the profession was an important aspect of the programme with the Academic and Special Libraries Section taking the lead. Its Careers Breakfast in University College Dublin, School of Library & Information Studies, provided a forum for experienced professional librarians to share their career paths and advise with students and to offer guidance on job-seeking to upcoming graduates. On a lighter note and on another day, the Section's Committee organised a Quiz Night in The Vaults: a great turn-out ensured a fun night.

Bibliophile and Irish media personality, Ryan Tubridy, launched the Week in the Royal Irish Academy, Dublin on 26 February.

The Management Team for Library Ireland Week was led by Kathryn Smyth, University College Dublin. Louise Farragher, Health Research Board, developed the website. Publicity materials extended the 2008 Silent/Listen theme. Administrative support was provided by the Association's Development Officer, Jane Clavin.

Plans for Library Ireland Week 2010 are underway: it is scheduled for 8-13 March.

Education Committee

During the year, the Committee met four times. At the 2009 AGM, Bernard Barrett (HSE-West) was presented with the certificate of Associateship of the Library Association of Ireland.

Four CPD courses were approved. These included three organized by Sections/Groups and one organized by the Acquisitions Group of Ireland (AGI).

- Introduction to Acquisitions (Acquisitions Group of Ireland)
- Effective Coaching & Mentoring Techniques for Managers and Team Leaders (HSLG)
- Critical Appraisal Skills (HSLG)
- Web 2.0 tools to promote you and your information service (HSLG)

A list of currently approved CPD courses is available on the website. The Committee welcomes enquiries from any Group or Section or any LIS body outside the Association structure which wishes to have CPD courses approved. At the time of writing, the Association has had discussions with the Academic and National Library Cooperative Training (ANLTC) and it is hoped that progress can be made on giving accreditation to CPD courses in the context of SILS accreditation.

European and International Panel

The Panel conducts all of its business electronically.

At European level, all LIS associations have been monitoring the Google Book Search Settlement Agreement. The Association endorsed the EBLIDA Position Statement on the Settlement especially in relation to monopoly, control, privacy and censorship. http://www.eblida.org/uploads/eblida/10/1252227760.pdf

The Association's concern on the impact of the settlement on European authors and publishers and the possible effects of the latter on libraries was noted.

The Vienna Declaration ...

(http://www.conference.bvoe.at/docs/Vienna_Declaration.pdf) was agreed at the joint EBLIDA/NAPLE conference in Vienna. EBLIDA suggested that all European LIS associations should lobby their MEP candidates on this declaration. Several candidates replied assuring the Association of support on the issues raised in the Vienna Declaration: White Paper on public libraries in the knowledge society; knowledge centres; copyright issues and European projects.

International Federation of Library Associations (IFLA)

The World Library and Information Congress: the 75th IFLA General Conference and Assembly was held in Milan from 23-27 August. The theme of this year's conference was 'Libraries create futures: building on cultural heritage'.

LAI members Monica Cullinan (University College Dublin) and Marjory Sliney (Fingal County Libraries) attended the main conference. Some LAI members also attended pre-conference satellite meetings. Madelaine Dennison (Oireacthtas) attended the Library and Research Services for Parliaments Section conference in Rome. Eva Hornung (Curriculum Development Unit, CDVEC) spoke in Bologna at a joint meeting of the CPD and Workplace Learning Section and the New Professionals Discussion Group.

The Finances and General Purposes Committee (FGP) has a wide-ranging remit which includes administrative matters such as finance, governance, membership and publications. The committee met six times in the period April 2009 to January 2010, in advance of Executive Board meetings.

The FGP, in conjunction with the Honorary Treasurer of the Association, monitors the finances of the Association, which remain in a healthy state. This year's financial commitments included the publication of two issues of *An Leabharlann: the Irish Library*, payment of the Development Manager's salary and general administration of the association.

The committee also provided support for the committees, Groups and Sections involved in running Library Ireland Week. The FGP was involved in progressing motions carried at the AGM and in setting up and monitoring the work of the task forces related to the Executive Board's mandate.

The President held discussions with JSTOR with a view to having *An Leabharlann: the Irish Library* digitised.

On the recommendation of the FGP the Executive Board approved a once-off contribution of €250 towards an Irish *Information Literacy Practitioner of the Year Award* in conjunction with CONUL for the Librarians Information Literacy Annual Conference (LILAC) taking place at Limerick in March 2010.

The FGP oversaw the development of disability-proofed headed notepaper and compliment slips for the Association. Following requests from Groups and Sections, matching templates were prepared, thus ensuring consistent branding across the Association's Groups and Sections.

The AGM requested that Executive Board organise, manage and promote annual meetings of chairs of Groups and Sections with the President or Vice-President of the LAI, meetings of secretaries of Groups and Sections with the Hon. Secretary of the LAI and meetings of treasurers of Groups and Sections with the Hon. Treasurer of the association. The FGP facilitated and organised a number of meetings which proved to be very useful.

To honour Professor Mary Burke's contribution to the work of the Association on her retirement from University College Dublin School of Information and Library Studies, the committee recommended to the Executive Board that a contribution be made to the scholarship fund for postgraduates initiated by Prof. Burke.

North - South Liaison Committee

This committee was convened to organise the joint conference which took place in Belfast, the report of which appears earlier in this publication. The committee comprising Deirdre Ellis-King, Siobhán Fitzpatrick, Elga Logue, Katherine McCloskey and Mary Murphy, met on a number of occasions in 2008-9, in Dublin and Belfast.

Task Force on Information Literacy

To advance recommendations of the LAI WGIL report in seeking a national Information Literacy strategy for Ireland

WGIL: Working Group on Information Literacy was established on foot of a resolution at the Association AGM in 2005. The Group met regularly from 2006 onwards and submitted a comprehensive report to the Executive Board in 2009. The report reviewed current IL activity in Ireland – across all sectors – and made recommendations for further action.

Philip Cohen, member of Executive Board, agreed to refine the WGIL report by updating the research data, prioritising the key recommendations and developing suggested actions to deliver those recommendations.

That work is almost complete. Members of the original Working Group and members of the Executive Board will then meet to form *TFIL*: Task Force on Information Literacy to review findings







of the WGIL report, prioritise its recommendations, progress those that appear easily achievable, propose an action plan for others, identify resource requirements for future work.

TFIL is to report to the Executive Board by early 2010.

 - accreditation and education;
 - finance:
 - activities:
 - structure (panels, committees and task forces);
 - officerships;
 - formalisation of FLAI and ALAI;
 - relationship to fraternal and to sister organizations.
- 2. To seek expert advice, which may include legal advice, as may be required.
- To compile a report with suggested amendments/additions/deletions as may be deemed necessary and to present this to the AGM for ratification.

In order to complete the task research was allocated to the members of the committee:

- study the rules and regulations of sister associations;
- study the Rules and Regulations of Irish professional associations;
- · review specialist areas;
- · an appeal for suggestions via Leabharlann-e.



2009 marked a busy year for the Cataloguing and Indexing Group (CIG). It began on 23 March with an informal event at the RIA where Dot Porter of the Digital Humanities Observatory gave a lecture on the topic of 'DHO, metadata, and possibilities for digital collaboration in Ireland'. The talk attracted some 50 attendees and gave those present an opportunity to network with colleagues from other institutions.

22 members enjoyed a visit to the Chester Beatty Library in July and were given a fascinating tour of the collection by Charles Horton, Curator of the Western Collections.

In response to feedback from members a Library of Congress Subject Headings training course, delivered by Keith Trickey (Liverpool John Moores University), was held on 8 September in the NLI. The course was fully subscribed and well received, with 23 attendees from around the country.

The National Library of Ireland also hosted the Group's annual seminar in November. Entitled 'The Future of Cataloguing', the 36 attendees were treated to a series of stimulating talks from the following speakers: Gordon Dunsire (Centre for Digital Library Research, University of Strathclyde), Claire Dupont (Library, Université Catholique de Louvain), Dot Porter (DHO), Katherine McSharry (Sources Project, National Library of Ireland), Orna Roche (University College Dublin) and Grace Toland (Irish Traditional Music Archive). A lively panel discussion was held at the end of each session.

The Annual General Meeting of the County and City Librarians Section (CCLS) was held in Tullamore, Co. Offaly, in October 2009, with the above officers elected.

Significant issues discussed by the members during the year, included: Public Library Research Fund application, School Library Services, Training, Borrowbooks, the Irish Joint Fiction Reserve Scheme, and Cross-border co-operation.

Many CCLS members attended the CILIP Ireland/LAI Annual Joint Conference 2009 'Managing change in the information age' in Belfast from 29 April to 1 May. During the conference, Laurence Kelly, Principal Officer at the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government, lead a workshop on *Branching Out: Future Directions*.

Issues addressed included the Library building capital programme and the revision of departmental procedures for grant applications. Both of these are subject to constraints, the former due to funding and the latter by law and practice. However, the Department is committed to maximising resources around the country and supporting achievable projects, where possible.

Assurance was given of support from Ministers and the Department for the essential role of libraries in society with particular recognition of the contribution of libraries to social inclusion,

lifelong learning, service delivery through ICT, the dissemination of environmental information and the promotion of active citizenship.

This workshop provided an excellent opportunity to discuss the implementation of the new policy and identify priorities. Support was also assured for the proposal to set up a working committee with representatives of the Department, An Chomhairle Leabharlanna, and members of this Section.

An introductory meeting with Irene Knox, Chief Executive of Libraries Northern Ireland, and Helen Osborn, Director of Service Delivery Libraries NI was scheduled alongside the conference. An update on the implementation of the new public library structure in Northern Ireland was given and areas of potential Cross-Border co-operation identified. A sub-group of the CCLS meets with Northern Ireland colleagues to develop areas of common interest in the public library sector, and a number of CCLS members are also on COLICO (Committee on Library Co-Operation) where wider library and information issues are progressed.

The title of the Autumn Seminar, held in Tullamore in October, was 'Leadership in this challenging environment'. The programme was lead by Dr Pauline Connolly and Siobhán Bradley of the Institute of Public Administration and sessions included 'Perspectives and insights into effective leadership', 'Adaptive leadership', 'Reflection on current challenges and innovative practices', and 'Case consultation'. The keynote address was given by Joe Horan, South Dublin County Manager – 'Innovation and change in local government'.

The Section welcomed Georgina Byrne, Bernadette Fennell, Mary Stuart and Helen Walsh appointed as South Dublin, Louth, Offaly and Clare County Librarians respectively.

To mark their retirement and to honour their contributions to the development of the public library service, presentations were made to Ann Coughlan, retired Offaly County Librarian and Jim Fogarty, retired Kilkenny County Librarian.

The networking morning discussion section was chaired by Eileen O'Connor (Galway venue) and Olive Greaney (Castlebar venue). Topics for discussion included funding and cross sectoral co-operation between libraries.


Co-operation between Academic Libraries and Public Libraries was also discussed. It was suggested that WRSLAI initiate the implementation of Pathways to Learning in the Western Region. It was suggested that greater co-operation could enhance library service provision and maximise resources. It was agreed that this would be considered for discussion by the committee to see what action could be initiated. It was acknowledged that, while there is inter library co-operation at an informal level in the western region, co-operation on a more formal footing would be advantageous.

The seminar was entitled 'In the beginning was the word: the evolution of the written word and the recording of knowledge' and took place in Castlebar Public Library, Co. Mayo in June. The conference programme opened with a talk by Dr. Mark Stansbury (Classics Department, NUI Galway) entitled 'The history of paleography and the history of Irish manuscripts'. This was followed by a talk by Sinéad McCoole (Curator of the Jackie Clarke Library and Archives, Co. Mayo) entitled 'Ireland's newest national treasure'. The third speaker was Bernadette Lally, author of 'Print culture in Loughrea 1850-1900' and she was followed by a joint presentation by Mary Ann Bolger and Clare Bell (Dublin Institute of Technology) on Irish typefaces entitled 'Divided by a common language: Irish typefaces'. The seminar ended with a presentation by Richard Hickey (Librarian, Mayo County Library) on the digitization of local newspapers and parish surveys in County Mayo.

2009 Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting took place in the Museum of Country Life, Turlough House, Castlebar, Co. Mayo on 15 December. There was no change in the committee except for the replacement of Kay McCormack (Galway County Libraries) by Tom Murtagh (Mayo County Library). Many counties had little or no monies to provide activities for Children's Book Festival this year. Some counties did get authors or residencies from CBI, which were very helpful. Others developed their own programmes as heretofore.

Due to various constraints, the YLG did not have as productive year as previous years but we hope this may change for 2010.
