## **Foreword**

his years' annual report reflects the continuing vibrancy of a professional organisation which has grown in stature and status over a period of eighty years. The programme of the Joint Conference alone, incorporating presentations on the digitisation of the 1911 census, on a strategic vision for the National Library, on the concept of the European Library, on the potential for cross-border library co-operation, on managing special collections, on the development of professional education...to name only a few, provides an overview of a profession which concerns itself with the future, while preserving, supporting and strengthening opportunities for access to knowledge of the past. That suggests a sense of purpose built on a corner stone of valuing education and information provision in Irish life. I believe that such a sense of purpose, a purpose on which the Library Association of Ireland was built, emerges strongly from the reports of sections and groups, their activities as detailed in the body of this report, clearly focused on 'moving forward'.

The Executive Board working directly and through its standing Committees, exemplifies the future focused agenda of the Association in a changing world. Professional education continued in 2008 to be a leading agenda item with a particular focus on continuing professional development, on encouraging participation in the Associateship and Fellowship programmes, and on upholding standards of professional education within a European and international qualifications framework. The Finance Committee continued during the year to deal effectively with issues of corporate governance, particularly financial regulation. Taking account of external factors likely to affect professional practice, the Board also participated in consultative processes related to the Public Lending Remuneration Scheme and on copyright. Reflecting the need to support an informed membership, it also endorsed the publication, under the editorial control of Marjory Sliney, of a revitalised An Leabharlann: the Irish Library, and the continuing promotion of the sector to the public at large through Library Ireland Week. This event indeed serves to remind both public and professional of the importance of the knowledge society in its broadest sense, this being rooted in the concept of the 'informed citizen' and the 'informed community'. I must, on your behalf, thank the officers and members of the Executive Board, for the commitment, time, energy and enthusiasm, they provide in ensuring the effective governance of the Association.

2008 was indeed a special year, and it is worth noting the enthusiasm with which the Association and its groups and sections celebrated our 8oth anniversary. I will mention only the special celebratory dinner held in Dublin's Mansion House, the location of the inaugural meeting of the Library Association of Ireland in 1928. There, we took the opportunity to remind ourselves of the legacy of purpose which underlines our origins. It was my privilege to welcome many of our former Presidents to the event and to present them with a commemorative scroll. Their spontaneous recollections, on the night, of involvement in the

Michael Plaice, Senior Executive Librarian, Cork County Library & Arts Service, and Hazel Percival, Executive Librarian, Wexford County Library, were returned as Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer respectively. Gerard Maher, County Librarian, Laois County Library, was returned as Honorary Auditor.

## Resolutions Passed at the meeting for action by the Executive Board

- That the incoming Executive Board facilitates and promotes the following annual meetings, in addition to the existing annual meeting of the Executive Board with the Sections & Groups:

## **Joint Conference 2008**

he 2008 LAI/CILIP Joint Conference took place at the Radisson SAS Hotel, Athlone, from 15th to 17th April 2008. The conference, entitled Future-proofing the Past: 80 years' commitment to access and cooperation, was officially opened by the President of the Library Association of Ireland (LAI), Deirdre Ellis-King, who welcomed the delegates and wished them well in their deliberations at this conference, the 44th joint conference of the LAI and CILIP Ireland, occurring in the 80th year of the LAI. The conference was attended by 120 delegates.

The Opening Session entitled 'The European Library' was given by Louise Edwards, General Manager of the European Library. In the course of her forty-minute paper an overview of the participants in and the contents of this portal were given to participants. The European Library, based at the Koninklijke Bibliotheek, in The Hague, is an initiative of the Conference of European National Librarians (CENL), a foundation aimed at increasing access to the national libraries of Europe. Stretching to Armenia and soon to include the national libraries of Russia and Turkey, it already provides access to the catalogues of 47 national libraries, amounting to 170 million records.

The subject of 'Libraries on the Agenda' was examined next by Alan Hassan, President, CILIP Scotland. Alan spoke about future-proofing the past in the context of dealing with the political imperatives set by our masters. He pointed to some of the paradoxes which coexist in society today, including the fact that while society is, in general, more affluent, there is less willingness to support a panoply of services. He described the current Scottish situation, where emphasis is on the setting of five priorities with 15 outcomes at national and 55 at local level. This approach drills down very deeply at local level. On the positive side, there have been innovative responses to this reductionist approach, for example, authorities are looking at new models of structure, e.g. setting up trusts which have financial advantages and can help offset staff losses. Alan

concluded by confirming that libraries have been managing decline for a number of years, and needed to re-examine our mission and determine the resources required to deliver it.

The Tuesday session closed with a presentation by Ms Hayley Harris, Alexander Street Press on the product, Music Online.

The second day was members' day and began with the Presidential Address from Deirdre Ellis-King, President, LAI on, 'Tracing the path of professional education for public library staffs: 1928-2008'. Deirdre explored the various means by which public library staff acquired professional training prior to the formation of the LAI and subsequently. She particularly emphasised the tough economic conditions which prevailed in the emergent state and the consequent difficulty of ensuring that high standards of training and education were met. This placed demands on the association who set the standards and prioritised professional training. The LAI was incorporated in 1952 and distance learning activities were in place in the early 1950s. The President emphasised the need to maintain vigorous re-training processes which would be necessitated by changes in society and the continuing need for professional postgraduate education.

Following Deirdre's address parallel sessions took place.

#### 'Services for All'

Pat Beech, (Royal National Institute for the Blind Library) emphasised the need to listen to blind people in order to provide services which are inclusive and equitable. She pointed out that the legislation only demands minimum requirements whereas we should aim for the maximum standards of provision. Blind people should be able to access information, which is their right, without intermediaries. The situation invites us to have policies to address the needs of blind and poorsighted members of the community, to consult

and develop community profiles, and to provide a wide-range of stock in all formats, among other possible initiatives.

Niall Crowley (Chief Executive, The Equality Authority), then stated that *Services for All* equates to a standard for equality. Equality should be a high standard and access should be the aim. Equality should be part of the decision-making process. He spoke about the implications of diversity and the barriers to equality of access which can be either physical or attitudinal. Referring to the *Equal Status Acts*, Niall said that compliance is the bottom line. Services should be pro-active in terms of equality. It is important to create an approach that is endemic rather than championed by individuals. Organisations should engage in evidence-based, participative, decision-making.

#### 'Digitising our Past I'

The Changing Libraries Digitisation Programme was presented by Joan Ward, (An Chomhairle Leabharlanna/The Library Council). Joan described the Changing Libraries Programme, whose aim is to digitise local content and make it available online via the web site, Ask about Ireland. The site contains documents, images, links and contacts. Digitisation is labour intensive, but positive outcomes are: ease of

access; raising of the local library profile, and the fact that digitisation helps to preserve the original objects.

#### 'Digitising Our Past 2'

Caitríona Crowe, (The National Archives), spoke on *The 1911 Census in the National Archives* and took the audience on a fascinating tour of the digitised 1911 Census, a project undertaken by the National Archives (Ireland) in partnership with the Library & Archives Canada. She explained that Ireland is unique in that it is the only country which preserved the original census forms. Added value has been added to the web site via the introduction of selections from photographic collections of the National Library of Ireland and the Royal Society of Antiquaries of Ireland, and tram timetables from the resources of the Irish Railway Record Society.

EU Information Everywhere: The Europe Direct Service was presented by Maureen Kerr, (Donegal County Library). Maureen began by describing the origins of the Europe Direct Service which arose in the context of a negative perception of the European Union (EU) as being bureaucratic and remote. The aim is to bring the EU closer to the individual citizen by providing information on opportunities offered by the Union, information about the EU and how to make your



voice heard in Europe. The service is funded by the European Commission with a grant to the Library Council for maintenance of the Web site.

The Director of the National Library of Ireland (NLI) Aongus Ó hAonghusa, and Katherine McSharry, Assistant Keeper II. NLI, talked on The National Library of Ireland: Recent Strategic and Digital Developments. Aongus Ó hAonghusa welcomed the opportunity to speak at the conference about developments at the NLI including a new Strategic Plan, 2008-10. The National Library holds over 8 million items, and underwent a change in status in 2005, whereby it gained a governing board and is now an autonomous cultural institution. This change offers new challenges and opportunities. The library aims to be a worldclass institution by 2020, and has identified key strategic aims and objectives which are elaborated in the Strategic Plan, copies of which were circulated in the delegates' conference packs. Katherine McSharry elaborated the Library's plans to digitise images from the collections and the ongoing digitisation of major bibliographic resources such as Hayes's Manuscript sources for the history of Irish civilisation.

The COLICO Lecture: Cross-border working makes sense, but more needs to be done, was delivered by Andy Pollak, Director, Centre for Cross-Border Studies, and Secretary, Universities Ireland. COLICO (Committee on Library Co-operation in Ireland) is a North-South body whose function is to optimise the collective value of the combined resources of Irish libraries for their clienteles. Andy Pollak spoke about the work of the Centre for Cross Border Studies (CCBS) and indicated key factors for good practice in North-South co-operation. The CCBS is one of the most significant non-governmental North-South bodies to have emerged since the 1998 Belfast Agreement. Andy outlined the wide range of activities and research projects at all levels, which the CCBS has facilitated or managed. These include training public and civil servants in North-South co-operation. Andy emphasised the need, above all, to 'do things which make sense' and bring real benefits to the people of both jurisdictions.

#### 'Curators of the Carriers of Civilisation'

Evelyn Flanagan UCD and Marie Boran NUL gave a joint presentation on The Role of the Rare Books Librarian in the 21st Century in which they outlined the wide variety of collections handled by Special Collections librarians, the attendant activities for example, conservation, training readers in handling the collections, building up the collections, digitisation, organising lectures, exhibitions, classes etc. Marie and Evelyn referred in particular to the work of the LAI Rare Books Group, and the services which it offers to those working, however marginally, with rare books or special collections. These include cataloguing workshops, seminars on topics such as maps, drawings, ephemera, history of science collections, visits and lectures. The group has also published seminar papers and other works of interest to librarians, historians and bibliographers.

Resource Description and Access (RDA): A New International Standard, was presented by Ann Chapman, UKOLN, and Chair of CILIP/BL Committee on AACR/RDA. Ann described RDA as a new standard for creating bibliographic metadata, drawing on AACR and taking into account the requirements of bibliographic records and the often complex relationships introduced by multimedia and a plethora of formats and activities. Ann gave examples of how the rules might be applied in practice: many of the applications are simpler and more practical than the old rules permitted. RDA will be published as an online resource; the demo version will be shown at IFLA 2008. The national libraries will lead the field in implementation.

The conference featured a lively trade exhibition, a civic reception hosted by Athlone Town Council, an enjoyable conference dinner and a visit to the Athlone Library and Civic Centre with a tour of the Aidan Heavey Special Collection.

## **8oth Anniversary Dinner**

he LAI celebrated its 80th anniversary in the most appropriate of locations by holding among other events an anniversary dinner in the Oak Room of the Mansion House on 23rd of October. The Oak Room was the location for the first meeting of the LAI in October 1928, and 56 members, including 8 past Presidents of the LAI enjoyed a predinner reception, hosted by the Lord Mayor of Dublin, Councillor Eibhlin Byrne. The Lord Mayor expressed her delight at being able to host the association on such a historic occasion. The LAI President Deirdre Ellis-King, in her turn thanked the Lord Mayor for her hospitality, and later in her address to attending members paid tribute to all the hard work and commitment to high standards of professionalism that went into running a professional association, over such an extended period. A scrolling exhibition of historical photographs from the LAI archives, and other sources was on display also. A presentation was made on the night to the past Presidents, a number of whom made impromptu and very entertaining speeches. An after-dinner speech on the

contribution of libraries to society, and their impact on his life was given by Dublin author, Pat Liddy.

## Development Manager's Report 2008

he post of Development Manager was held by Marian Keyes until 30th September 2008 when she left to take up a research scholarship for her PhD studies.

#### Library Ireland Week 2008

The Development Manager co-ordinated Library Ireland Week 2008, working initially with a group set up by Executive Board Member, Louise Farragher and composed of librarians and information professionals nationwide. Library Ireland Week took place from 3rd -9th March and was launched by author Joseph O'Connor and LAI President, Deirdre Ellis-King, at a reception at the National Library of Ireland on Thursday 28th February. Over 100 people attended the launch which was sponsored by John Treacy of International Education Services.

One of the most significant innovations for 2008's Library Ireland Week was the brand new website designed by Louise Farragher in partnership with Gillian Colton. A regular blog informed everyone regarding publicity materials, quizzes, sponsors and new developments. Fifteen librarians from an impressive cross section of library environments shared their work experiences in the section entitled *A Day in your Life*. Twenty-five authors, artists and journalists responded to a feature on their *Favourite Libraries*, demonstrating the importance of libraries

and their contribution to the creative process. Speeches from the launch in the National Library were recorded and made available as podcasts on the website. Joseph O'Connor's moving presentation was also published by the LAI in *An Leabharlann: the Irish Library* 17 (3).

Two events in particular during Library Ireland Week generated a great deal of media interest and these were the virtual events initiated by UCD and numerous showings of *The Hollywood Librarian* documentary, directed by Ann Seidl. Cathal McCauley of UCD coordinated several tours on Second Life and in partnership with Professor Mary Burke of the School of Library and Information Studies, carried out UCD's first lecture on Second Life. The Irish première of *The Hollywood Librarian* had been shown at the HSLG conference in February and was shown subsequently the length and breadth of the country during Library Ireland Week, with a gala showing at the Irish Film Institute in Dublin. Ann generously gave 25 copies of her DVD on loan and the Development Manager distributed these over the following six months to numerous venues and festivals. Ann also held an interactive Q&A event on Second Life, coordinated by UCD.

PR for Library Ireland Week was carried out by the working group, and proved very successful. Radio ads were aired for three weeks through the RTÉ Supporting the Arts scheme and interviews were recorded with the Dave Fanning Show, Newstalk, 103.2 Dublin City FM and Raidio na Life. TV features included Rob a Job for ICE on RTÉ 2, filmed in Cabra Library during Library Ireland Week and later in the week, author Claire Hennessy appeared on RTÉ 2. Newspaper coverage was extensive with photos and articles in The Irish Independent, The Irish Times, Southside People, Sunday Tribune, The Tallaght Voice, Clare Champion and a host of other local newspapers countrywide. Thanks to the generosity of numerous sponsors, it was possible to host competitions through the website during Library Ireland Week, attracting hundreds of entries.

The posters for 2008 were designed in a different colour scheme from 2007's design. Publicity material was sent to all institutional members of the LAI and all libraries holding events for Library Ireland Week. Further supplies were ordered via the website as demand arose

#### LAI/CILIP (Ireland) Joint Conference


The Development Manager was Conference Secretary for the LAI/CILIP (Ireland) Joint Conference which took place from 15th-17th April at The Radisson Hotel, Athlone. In consultation with the conference committee, this involved coordinating bookings via the online system created by Brendan Teeling and Louise Farragher, overseeing production of the conference booklet and packs and liaising closely with the hotel and the technical support company. Responsibility for promoting sponsorship opportunities and the trade exhibition for the conference was part of the remit and forty-four trade delegates attended, twenty two companies with exhibition stands and five without stands. 157 delegates attended the conference overall.

The title of the Joint Conference was Future-Proofing the Past: 80 Years Commitment to Access and Cooperation. Staff from Westmeath County Council Libraries, led by County Librarian Mary Farrell, were involved at all stages of the planning of the conference and a photo report featuring many of their images from the conference is available in An Leabharlann: the Irish Library 17 (3). A useful online feedback form created by Louise Farragher provided important suggestions and comments which will be invaluable for future conference planning.

#### An Leabharlann: the Irish Library

The Development Manager worked closely with Marjory Sliney, Editor of *An Leabharlann: the Irish Library* and was the Production and Distribution Manager of two issues, 17 (2) and 17 (3). The journal

was posted to all personal and institutional members and extra copies were made available to promote the Library Association at conferences and events. A print run of 1,200 copies for each issue was produced. It is hoped to expand the list of subscribers from the March 2009 issue onwards and letters have been sent to all on the current list of





#### Leabharlann-e

The LAI electronic newsletter *Leabharlann-e* was published twelve times in 2008 and was prepared and edited by Michael Plaice when the post of Development Manager was vacant. The Development Manager had secured sponsorship of €75 per month from Brendan Bannigan of The Open Book Company Library Service. This goes towards a prize for the popular monthly quiz and came into effect from February 2008.

#### **8oth Anniversary Dinner**

The 80th Anniversary Dinner of the Library Association of Ireland was held on Thursday 23rd October 2008 and the Development Manager coordinated bookings and official invites for this event.

#### Packs to new members

New members of the LAI continue to receive a pack containing a welcome letter from the LAI President, the current annual report, a memorandum and articles of association, an information leaflet about the LAI, a leaflet about associateship and the most recent issue of *An Leabharlann: the Irish Library*. The Development Manager works with the Treasurer on this project and forwards packs to new members and adds their details to electronic mailing lists.

#### **Education Committee**

The Committee met five times during the year. In addition, between meetings much work was done electronically.

Apart from initial professional education, the committee has been involved in ensuring that LAI members are aware of the importance of being

involved in Continuing Professional Development (CPD). The committee has recommended that each LAI member should undertake a minimum of twenty-five CPD hours per annum. It is incumbent on all professional librarians to keep their knowledge up-to-date whether by means of attendance at formal CPD courses or other activities such as reading professional journals, writing for the professional press etc. To assist members organize their CPD activities and keep a record of them, a Learning Portfolio was launched at the end of the year. In addition, a CPD Record Sheet

Nine CPD courses run by sections/groups of the Association were approved during the year and Certicates of Attendance have been distributed.

At the 2008 AGM, Mary Conway (Waterford County), Carmel Daly (Clare), John Duffy (Bar Council Law Library), Marie Jennings (Oireachtas Library), Mary Murphy (Meath) and Orla Nic Aodha (St. Patrick's College, Dublin) were presented with their ALAI certificates. On the recommendation of this committee, the Executive Board has also awarded the ALAI to Bernard Barrett (HSE-West). This will be presented at the 2009 Annual General Meeting.

Members attended the Public Library Conference and the Youth Libraries Group Seminar to promote awareness of the Associateship. Another promotional opportunity was at an Academic and National Library Cooperative Training (ANLTC) Workshop at NUI, Maynooth. at which the secretary spoke on ALAI. During 2009, it is hoped to have a more strategic approach to promotion.

The committee recommended to the Executive Board that an Honorary Fellowship of the Library Association of Ireland be conferred on Professor John Dean, first Professor of the School of Information and Library Studies at University College, Dublin. An Extraordinary General Meeting was held on October for this purpose.

European Commission's *Green Paper on Copyright* in the Knowledge Economy is available on the LAI website under Policy Statements.

In conjunction with the Education Committee, the Panel continues to monitor developments in the European Qualifications Framework.

The Convenor of the Panel represented the Association at the European Bureau for Library, Information and Documentation Associations (EBLIDA) Annual Council meeting in The Hague.

The Finances and General Purposes Committee (F&GP) has a wide ranging remit which deals with administrative matters such as finance, membership and publications. The committee met seven times during the year, in advance of Executive Board meetings.

The F&GP, in conjunction with the association treasurer, monitors the finances of the association, which remain in a healthy state. This year's financial commitments included the publication of two issues of An Leabharlann: the Irish Library, payment of the Development Manager's salary, staging the joint conference and general administration of the association. The committee examined the membership of the association, and have put in train plans to use an online model. This will allow for more streamlined access to the membership database for administration purposes. The F&GP investigated digitising the LAI archive and creating an oral archive of association history. In October, the Government Libraries Section (GLS) held a day-long conference in the Bedford Suite, Dublin Castle. The theme of the conference was *Publishing Government E-Information: Challenges and Opportunities* and it featured speakers from both the academic and public sector.

Grainne Maclochlainn (National Library of Ireland) gave a presentation on strategies for development of digital access to open-access repositories; lan Cornelius (School of Library and Information Studies) spoke about information policy issues; George Moir from the OPW explained the practice behind government publishing on the web; Niamh Brennan (Trinity College, Dublin) spoke about open access to research and institutional repositories, and Margaret Flood (Trinity College, Dublin) and Colette O'Flaherty (National Library) ended the morning session with a talk on electronic legal deposit. The afternoon session began with a presentation from GLS committee member Joe Donnelly, who highlighted on behalf of the GLS, various issues relating to electronic publishing by government bodies; David Flood (Enterprise Ireland) and Miriam Walsh (Teagasc) discussed intellectual property rights and public sector information. The final speaker was John Dolan (Department of Finance) who presented the European Union perspective of public sector information.

The conference ended with a general discussion before a tour of the State Apartments, courtesy of the OPW.

The GLS held its AGM in May, which included a presentation from Marian Keyes on her role as Development Manager within the Library Association.

Major issues of interest to the GLS this year included copyright, open-access repositories, professional standards for librarians within government librarians (including qualifications, continuing professional development, salaries) and creation of a union catalogue.

The group had two meetings during the year and were represented at two other Executive Board meetings. Areas being actively promoted by the Irish Language group during 2008 included the drive to increase the use of the Irish language in libraries with the public and among staff. In this survey the question was also asked if the scheme under the *Acht Teanga (Languages Act)* had been adopted and the result showed that of the twenty-six who replied sixteen replied *Yes* and ten *No*.

#### **Prison Libraries Group**

The development of prison libraries throughout the country is being conducted in association with the relevant local authorities and the Irish Prison Service. Current developments, plans, strategies and objectives for the prison libraries continue to be explored under the initial strategy statement of 2003, the *Development of Library Services in Prisons*. Targets relating to the phased implementation and various revised proposals for the development of services including infrastructure, staffing, opening hours and capital finance requirements are some of the key discussion elements of the working group agenda.

The Prison Library Group, have been actively engaged with these strategies and formally met on two occasions in 2008, in Portlaoise in March and Limerick in September. At the request of the group Mr Kevin Warner, Education Coordinator with The Irish Prison service attended the March meeting and gave an outline and overview of the current issues and developments.

These issues concerned particular reports in respect of individual Prison Library Services developments at Wicklow, Roscommon, Limerick, Cork, Dublin and Laois. The roll out and timeframe delivery of services had to be considered both in light of the nature and status of prison library services required and the pressure on funding. The financial implications for both capital and revenue expenditure had increased substantially and clarification and approval for various projects was been made in each case. Arrangements for the delivery of services were being progressed with each Library Authority.

The staffing agreements and arrangements within the Prison Library Services are dependent on a number of factors. These include the nature, status and size of the prison services, the type of service required, the crucial role played by Prison/Library Officers in supporting the delivery of services, the security and operation, local support arrangements with the Library Authorities and the overall discretion and decisions of the Governors. Agreements in terms of positions and grades have been reached

A number of further issues relating to the development of services formed part of the groups discussions during the year including the broadening of membership and representation of the group, the education and learning programmes with the Vocational Education Committees, the cooperation and involvement with the education units within the prison, the increase in Open University participation and the application of standards and models of service delivery to ensure

During the year the group discussed the proposal and need to develop and work on a five year plan, setting out the direction envisaged for the prison libraries over the coming years. It is hoped that the scope of this plan apart from recognising the current primary stakeholders would be broadened to include other agencies and would involve research and best practice from an international perspective.

They also presented feedback on the scheme to date.

Siobhán Arkins of Galway County Libraries gave a presentation on the *Health and Wellbeing Reading List* produced by Ballybane branch library in conjunction with the HSE and a report from Books Prescription Wales.

Denise Duffy of UCHG lead a discussion on an article entitled *Bibliotherapy for mental health service users: a systematic Review* by Deborah Fanner & Christine Urquhartt which was recently published in the *Health Information and Libraries Journal*.

Throughout the year, the committee have actively sought to encourage new members through our various events and competitions. Emails were sent to all CBF co-ordinators, County/City Librarians and LAI members who ticked the YLG box on their application form.

- to continue to develop our relationship with Children's Books Ireland and see how we can increase our contribution to the festival
- to facilitate another Recommending with Confidence Seminar

Success Stories 3 – 17th September 2008, Omagh Library, County Tyrone.

This is our second year to coordinate this event with colleagues in Northern Ireland Libraries. Eighty-four librarians from across the country participated on the day.

As like the previous Success Stories Days, the event was designed as a forum for the exchange of ideas and good practice and was aimed at frontline and support staff involved in developing and delivering innovative projects, programmes and activities in local libraries.

The workshop format involved four parallel sessions and there were twelve workshops in total, covering a range of themes

- · Services for Children & Young Adults
- Services for Children & Young Adults with disabilities

#### **Sections and Groups**

- Cultural Services
- Local History/Studies
- · Reader Development
- Social Inclusion
- Services for Older People

Each workshop was facilitated by staff from the Northern Ireland Library Boards and librarians from the Youth Library Group in the Republic. Each workshop highlighted two or three projects which had been submitted and staff directly involved in these gave a brief summary of what had been achieved and how. Then there was an opportunity for all participants to discuss what they had heard, to talk about other successful stories in their libraries and what might be implemented in their own library. Over seventy Success Stories were submitted in advance. Participating counties/Boards received a copy of all the stories on cd on the day.

Recommendations made by participants and committee:

- Attendance by a representative from the County/City Librarians from the Republic
- Attendance by a representative from the Library Association
- Annual local/regional Success Stories Day
- All Ireland Libraries Success Stories Day every two years
- Development of a link or database of the Success Stories for the LAI website

#### Children's Book Festival 2008

Once again CBF proved to be a very successful event with thousands of children and young people attending events in libraries throughout the country. Every year the events get bigger and better. This can only be achieved because of the dedicated librarians across the country – many of whom are YLG members. We also recognise that the Public Library Group members play a major role in putting the CBF together. The CBF is very much a joint effort.

As part of CBF the Youth Libraries group ran a new competition this year, Design a T-Shirt. A total of twenty-five library authorities participated. The two overall winners were judged by Oisin McGann, author/illustrator. Their t-shirts were printed and one was framed. All participating authorities received two €50 vouchers for their two winners. The competition was divided into under-11 and over-11 categories.

The Youth Library Group took the orders for the CBF bookfest guides/packs. All counties in the republic ordered some packs. A meeting was held with CBI about the packs and Bookfest guide. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided that from next year to leave all the ordering of the packs with CBI. It was felt that the Youth Library Group should be more involved with Bookfest guide, as last year (CBF 2007) no librarians were asked to review books, but this year we had a number of librarians doing reviews. It was recommended to CBI that they try to secure the authors who have been shortlisted for the Bisto Awards, for CBF and that libraries have guaranteed audiences. It was suggested that we put forward a nominee from the YLG to the Board of Directors of CBI at their next AGM, which will be May 2009.

#### **Recommending with Confidence, Seminar Day**

The committee were delighted to have Kathryn Crowley who is Director of the National Council for Curriculum & Assessment Unit, under the Department of Education & Science, and Rosemary Hetherington (Dublin City Libraries) as speakers at this seminar. Kathryn spoke about how the public libraries can support schools in teaching and learning across the curriculum. She also discussed the Home School Community Liaison project in schools which are designated disadvantaged. Rosemary spoke about how librarians can choose and recommend books for the developing readers. Over forty librarians attended this seminar, which took place in Blanchardstown Library.



#### Inis Magazine, Article

The committee were asked by submit an article on the issue of Age Banding on children's books. Maedhbh Rogan-McCann, wrote a fantastic article and this was published in *Inis*.

#### **Meeting with Discover Science**

Ellen Byrne, Science Week Coordinator and colleagues, met with the committee in September to showcase and discuss Science Week. This year they have changed from paper guides of their events to an online guide and they spoke about the possibility

of when they advertise the week, they advertise public libraries as a place to go to check out the events, via the public internet facilities. They have a certain amount of funding for events, but it must be booked well in advance. Suggestions for possible events will be considered for funding by them. This year they printed bookmarks and the youth library group took the orders for the bookmarks from libraries.

To conclude, the YLG has had a very productive and successful year and we hope to build on this success in 2009.
